2006-07 NOTES

SCHOOL RECORD

The Broncos increased their school record to six consecutive top three finishes in the MAC West by finishing in second during the 2006-07 season. The Broncos are still the only school to win back-to-back West Division crowns after winning the division in 2004 and 2005.

The next closest streak for the Broncos predates divisions when they were third, second, second and first from 1949-52.

DÉJÀ VU

In every year of head coach Steve Hawkins' tenure, his teams have been underestimated by the media in the preseason Mid-American Conference News Media Association poll. For the fourth year in a row WMU was picked to finish third in the MAC West and for the fourth year in a row WMU finished higher than expected with a second place finish in the division.

PLAYING THE BEST

Western Michigan played maybe the most ambitious schedule in school history by playing nine teams that made the 2007 postseason. At the start of conference play in the beginning of January, WMU had the fourth toughest schedule in the country (CollegeRPI.com/Jan. 4).

The Broncos played five NCAA Tournament teams (Pittsburgh, Indiana, Virginia Tech, Davidson, Miami-Ohio), the NIT champion (West Virginia) and three other NIT teams (Toledo, Marist, San Diego State).

PLAYING IT CLOSE

The Broncos finished at .500 with a 16-16 record, but they weren't far away from possibly racking up well over 20 wins with a roster that didn't feature a single senior. Of its 16 losses, WMU lost 11 by nine points or less, four by three points or fewer and three in overtime.

THE BEST WIN IN THE MAC

During the 2006-07 campaign, no team in the MAC had a better win than Western Michigan's Thanksgiving Night defeat of Virginia Tech, 71-68, in the opening round of the Old Spice Classic on ESPN2.

The Hokies finished the year No. 34 in the RPI, the highest ranked team defeated by a MAC member institution and one of only two wins by a MAC team against a team in the RPI Top 50 (Toledo def. VCU RPI No. 44). Virginia Tech swept North Carolina and nearly won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

Joe Reitz was named to the *ESPN the Magazine* Academic All-America First Team for his accomplishments on the court and in the classroom during the 2006-07 campaign.

Reitz has a 3.72 GPA in finance and is only the fourth player in WMU history to be named an Academic All-American and the first to ever be named to the first team. He became just the seventh player in MAC history to be named to the first team.

Reitz was also named Second Team All-MAC and Academic All-MAC for a second consecutive season after leading the Broncos with 13.9 points and 8.6 rebounds per game. He finished 12th in scoring, third in rebounding and eighth in field goal percentage (.560) in the MAC.

MORE OF THE REITZ STUFF

Joe Reitz has etched his name throughout the Western Michigan record book after a stellar first three years in the Brown & Gold. He is ninth all-time in scoring with 1,234 points and is within striking distance of Manny Newsome's school record of 1,786 points that has stood since 1964.

In other career statistics, Reitz is fourth all-time in field goal percentage (.542), free throws made (390) and free throws attempted (560).

Last season, Reitz set a new school record with 219 free throws attempted (made 145-seventh all-time) and pulled down 275 rebounds, 10th best in a single-season.

KOOL AID

2006 Michigan High School Mr. Basketball David Kool made an immediate impact on the Mid-American Conference as the runaway winner of the MAC Freshman of the Year Award after averaging 11.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.2 steals per game for the Broncos.

Kool led the MAC and was fifth in the country in free throw percentage (.917-second best all-time at WMU) and was third in three-point shooting (.419) in earning *Collegelnsider.com* Mid-Major All-America honors. In MAC play, Kool really came on and led WMU in scoring with 13.4 points per game.

STEADY AS SHAWNTÉS GOES

Sophomore Shawntés Gary made the leap during the 2006-07 campaign and earned Honorable Mention All-MAC honors after averaging 10.2 points (12.1 ppg in MAC games), 3.6 rebounds, 1.3 assists and a team-high 1.2 steals per game.

He was 29th in the MAC in scoring and 11th in free throw shooting (.762). An electric leaper, Gary also led the Broncos with 13 blocked shots.

OTHER PLAYER NOTES

Cleveland State transfer Michael Redell didn't wait to make an impact in his first season as the starting point guard for WMU. Against Pittsburgh, 2007 NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen participant, in the season opener Redell passed out nine assists on his way to leading the MAC in assists (142-4.44 apg-seventh highest total in single season at WMU).

Redell was also fourth in three-point shooting (.411) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.49) and 14th in free throw shooting (.754).

Sophomore Derek Drews was a lethal sniper from behind the three-point line for WMU. He finished first in the MAC (.463) and would have been among the top 10 shooters in the NCAA if he had met the NCAA minimum.

Sophomore Andre Ricks made his mark with a career-high 29 points in a win over previously undefeated San Diego State to earn *Collegelnsider.com* Mid-Major Player of the Week and MAC West Player of the Week honors. Ricks also made *SportsCenter's* Top 10 with a nifty drive and reverse layup against Virginia Tech in the Old Spice Classic. Ricks was fifth in the MAC in three-point shooting (.405).

THREE-POINT MARKSMEN

WMU finished 39th in the country in three-point shooting (.384) with four of the top five three-point shooters in the Mid-American Conference (Drews-first, Kool-third, Redell-fourth, Ricks-fifth).

SETTING MORE RECORDS

With a new offensive emphasizing attacking the basket to get layups or open three-pointers on kickouts, the Broncos set a new school record for free throws made in a season and second most attempts (568-788).

The team also finished with the third most three-pointers made and attempted in a single season (233-606) and the third most points scored in a single season (2,287).

Two University Arena records also fell as the Broncos made 16 steals against San Diego State and made 36 free throws vs. Valparaiso.

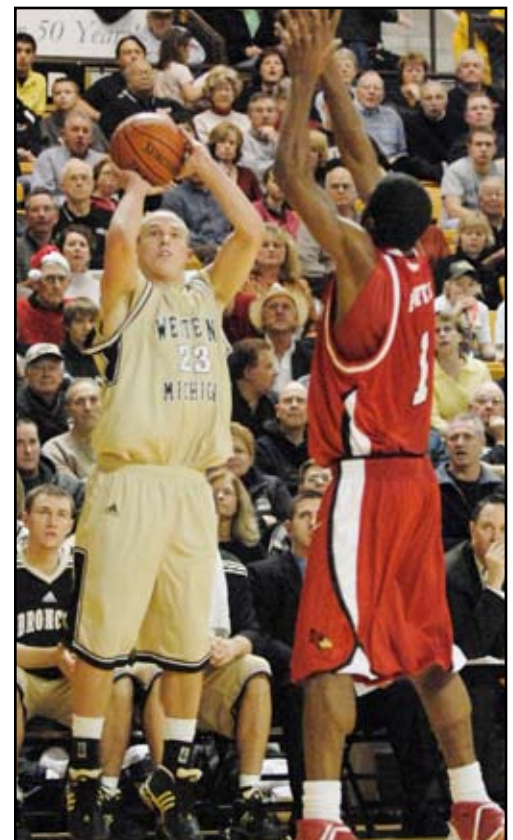
TROPHY COLLECTING

For a second straight season, Western Michigan won the Michigan MAC Men's Basketball Championship presented by the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame. The Broncos went 3-1 against Central Michigan and Eastern Michigan to claim the award. CMU went 2-2 and EMU went 1-3 in the series.

Using the criteria in place for the award, WMU would have won four years in a row and in five of the seven seasons Steve Hawkins has been at WMU.

HOME, SWEET HOME

Western Michigan has been a juggernaut at University Arena under head coach Steve Hawkins. The Broncos are 44-8 in the friendly confines of University Arena under Hawkins and 22-3 in nonconference home games.

South Alabama '87
Fifth Year at WMU (76-51)
14th Year as Head Coach (213-162)

Beginning his fifth season as head coach and eighth season at Western Michigan, Steve Hawkins is prepared to keep the Broncos at a level of success unparalleled in school history. The Broncos have made three of Western Michigan's six postseason appearances since Hawkins' arrival in Kalamazoo and have rattled off six straight top-three Mid-American Conference finishes, the best mark in school history.

Thanks to the team's efforts on the court, Bronco fans have been spoiled in recent campaigns with postseason appearances, all-conference caliber players, attendance records and television appearances (39 regional or national broadcasts since 2003-04).

WMU had three-straight 20-win seasons and postseason appearances from 2003-05, matching the previous total in both categories since the first season of Bronco basketball in 1913-14.

Since 2002-03, WMU is second in the MAC with 96 overall wins and third in conference wins with 55.

The Broncos faced their most ambitious schedule yet during the 2006-07 campaign. Going into conference play, the Broncos had the fourth toughest strength of schedule in the country (CollegeRPI.com/Jan. 4). The Broncos played five teams that made the 2007 NCAA Tournament (Davidson, Miami-Ohio, Virginia Tech, Pittsburgh, Indiana), postseason NIT champion West Virginia and three other NIT participants (Toledo, Marist, San Diego State).

The tough schedule saw Western Michigan make five national television appearances, including a victory over Virginia Tech on Thanksgiving Night at the Old Spice Classic in Orlando, Fla., that turned out to be the best win by a MAC team all season, as the Hokies finished 34th in the final RPI. Only one other MAC team posted a win against a team ranked in the RPI Top 50.

The Broncos finished the year with three all-conference players, including MAC Freshman of the Year David Kool. Joe Reitz was named Second Team All-MAC for a second straight season and Shawntés Gary was named Honorable Mention All-MAC. In his four seasons as head coach, Hawkins' players have earned 11 all-conference selections.

Even more impressive, Reitz was named an *ESPN the Magazine* First Team Academic All-American, the first Bronco in school history to ever earn that honor and only the seventh in MAC history. Reitz and Andrew Hershberger were also named Academic All-MAC for a second consecutive season and WMU has held down five of the 11 total spots on the last two Academic All-MAC teams.

During the spring of 2007, the NCAA released its most recent Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores and the Broncos were honored as being in the top-10 percent of Division I men's basketball programs.

After three straight 20-win seasons, the Broncos struggled out of the gate during the 2005-06, but rebounded under Hawkins' tutelage when conference play began.

In a season Hawkins' described as "the most rewarding in my career," the Broncos responded by putting themselves in position to win a third consecutive MAC West Division title on the final day of the regular season.

Not only were the Broncos successful on the court, but they continued to excel in the classroom. Senior Brian Snider and sophomores Reitz and Hershberger made up three-fifths of the Academic All-MAC team and Reitz became the first *ESPN the Magazine* Academic All-District IV First Team selection for WMU since 1993.

After a record-setting first year as head coach in 2003-04, the Broncos followed with a 20-win campaign and National Invitation Tournament appearance in 2004-05. WMU became the first program ever to defend its West Division title and featured the winningest senior class in school history.

WMU captured the MAC division, regular season and tournament championships en route to a 26-5 overall record in 2003-04, the highest total in school history. The team appeared in the NCAA Tournament for just the third time since the program's inception after claiming the league's automatic bid with Western Michigan's first MAC Tournament championship.

Along with individual and team success on the court, the Broncos gained national attention throughout the season. Included in the exposure was a national television broadcast (ESPN2) at University Arena, earned by the squad's quick start.

Voted the top rookie head coach by *Basketball Times* and Coach of the Year by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan, Hawkins has also helped renew interest on campus and in the community. Three of the top five crowds in the last 10 years have packed University Arena since Hawkins took over the reins to cheer the Brown & Gold to victory.

Players and coaches are heavily involved in organizations throughout the Kalamazoo area and the new student group, "The Zoo," was a focal point for Hawkins during the off-season.

Highly respected in his profession, Hawkins was a member of the Collegeinsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 voting panel each of the last two seasons.

He has assembled one of the top coaching staffs not only in the conference, but the region as well. WMU's recruiting efforts have reached new heights and for the first time in recent memory the program has received a pair of early commitments from a player in his junior year. Hawkins also helped WMU sign the first Michigan Mr. Basketball in school history with 2006 award winner David Kool beginning his career at WMU last season.

Named Western Michigan's 13th head coach on May 1, 2003, Hawkins didn't have to move any further than an office away after accepting the job. He had served the previous three seasons as the program's top assistant under former head coach Robert McCullum.

A 21-year veteran of the collegiate ranks, Hawkins captured his 200th career victory on Dec. 2, 2006, when WMU defeated previously unbeaten San Diego State, 84-73, at University Arena. He has settled in the Midwest after beginning his career as a student at South Alabama and before arriving in Kalamazoo had already displayed the ability to direct a quality program, both on the court and in the classroom, at the NCAA Division II level.

Hawkins, 44, served for nine seasons as head coach of the basketball program at Quincy University in Illinois. The Ventura, Calif., native guided the Hawks to an overall record of 137-111, a total that included three NCAA Division II Tournament selections.

In only his third year at Quincy, Hawkins guided the Hawks to a 19-9 record and the first of back-to-back NCAA berths. The following year (1994-95) Quincy advanced to the Great Lakes Region semifinals and earned a 23-7 record. QU also competed in the event in 1996-97.

He was named the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association NCAA Division II Coach of the Year four times.

Hawkins first broke into the collegiate profession at the University of South Alabama, where he worked for three seasons (1985-87) under head coach Mike Hanks as a student assistant.

After spending the 1987-88 campaign as a graduate assistant at Quincy, Hawkins spent the next two seasons as the top assistant coach at St. Andrew's College (NAIA) in Laurinburg, N.C.

He then returned to Quincy as an assistant coach for one season (1990-91) before assuming the head coaching duties in 1991-92.

At the age of 19, Hawkins was named the junior varsity coach at Villanova Prep High School (Ojai, Calif.), a position he held for two seasons. He followed that experience with a one-year stint as the junior varsity coach at St. Bonaventure High School (Ventura, Calif.) before moving from the West Coast.

Hawkins earned his bachelor's degree at South Alabama in 1987 and went on to claim his master's degree in sports science two years later at the United States Sports Academy.

Hawkins married the former Lana Widman in 1997. The couple resides in Kalamazoo.
